The Muggsy Bogues Family Foundation (MBFF) hosted its fourth annual Holiday Labor of Love food distribution event on Saturday, Dec. 17, at the Mecklenburg County Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) Board headquarters on North Tryon Street in Charlotte to better reach families living on Charlotte's westside.

Sponsored by Food Lion, Panthers Charities, Healthy Blue NC, The MJW Group LLC, and Microsoft, nearly 100 families (over 400 adults and children) facing food insecurity received food boxes and other necessities to support them for the holidays. Items included fresh produce, turkeys, canned goods, holiday pies, and more. Families also received information about utility assistance from Mecklenburg County DSS and workforce development information from NCWorks and She Built This City. Hygiene kits, socks, and gas and grocery gift cards were also distributed.

For the third year, 100 holiday gift bags were provided to The Salvation Army Center of Hope to make the holidays brighter for women living at the shelter. "This is our favorite Labor of Love event of the year," said Muggsy Bogues, President and Founder of the MBFF. "We find great satisfaction in bringing holiday joy to families in need during the holiday season."
